Statement on Ghislaine Maxwell Conviction



"When we break down the myths and the stereotypes associated with sex trafficking - the ideas of who the perpetrators and are, what they look like, where they exist in our society - we will realize fully that traffickers can be White men and women, very wealthy and powerful, and extremely confident in their ability to not get caught. I imagine that the now deceased financier Jeffrey Epstein and his right hand "lady of the house" Ghislaine Maxwell never conceived that their crimes would ever make it to a federal court since they did not fit the general depiction of a "pimp" and a "bottom."

"The terms we hear in the movies and may read about in the media are not just appropriate for describing sex traffickers in the "hood" and in low-income communities of color.
